

## **Claudio Marcocci**

Is Professor of Endocrinology at the Department of Clinical and Experimental Medicine, University of Pisa and Director of the Endocrine Unit 2, University Hospital of Pisa

Born in Pisa in 1952, he graduated with full honor in Medicine in 1976 and specialized with honor in Endocrinology in 1979 at the University of Pisa.

Recipient of a scholarship of the British Council he continued his post doctoral specialization at the Endocrine Unit, Royal Postgraduate Medical School of London in 1980-81 and as Visiting Associate at the Laboratory of Biochemical Pharmacology, NIADDK, National Institutes of Health, Bethesda, USA in 1983-84.

His major scientific interests are parathyroid and thyroid diseases, particularly primary hyperparathyroidism and Graves' orbitopathy. Over the last 10 years he has contributed original work on the management of Graves' orbitopathy, on the calcium sensing receptor, on clinical aspects of primary hyperparathyroidism and on the molecular mechanisms of parathyroid tumorigenesis.
